NOTES TO THE INFLATION ADJUSTED FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE SIX MONTHS ENDED 31 MARCH 2021

1. CORPORATE INFORMATION

Nampak Zimbabwe Limited is a public limited Company incorporated and domiciled in Zimbabwe. The main activities of the Group are manufacturing of paper, plastic and metal packaging products and leasing of biological assets and property. The abridged consolidated financial statements for Nampak Zimbabwe Limited and its subsidiaries (the Group) for the six months ended 31 March 2021 were authorised for issue in accordance with a resolution of the directors on 27 May 2021.

2. BASIS OF PREPARATION

These abridged consolidated financial statements have been prepared in accordance with International Financial Reporting Standards (IFRS), the disclosure requirements of the Zimbabwe Stock Exchange Listing Rules.

The consolidated financial statements of the Group have been prepared based on the current cost basis and adjusted for the effects of IAS 29 'Financial Reporting in Hyperinflationary Economies'. Comparative financial statements are restated using the general inflation indices in terms of the measuring unit current at the statement of financial position date. The primary financial statements of the Group are the inflation adjusted numbers.

* The historic amounts are shown as supplementary information. This information does not comply with the International Financial Reporting Standards in that it has not taken into account the requirements of International Accounting Standard 29 – Financial Reporting for Hyperinflationary Economies. As a result the auditors have not expressed an opinion on this historic financial information.

The conversion factors have been adopted from the Consumer Price Index (CPI) data prepared by the Zimbabwe National Statistics Agency (ZIMSTAT). The indices and conversion factors used to restate the financial results are as follows:

3. FUNCTIONAL AND PRESENTATION CURRENCY

These financial statements are presented in Zimbabwe dollars (ZW\$), which is the functional and presentation currency of the Group. All values are rounded to the nearest thousand except where otherwise stated.

4. STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICY

The principal accounting policies applied in the preparation of these financial statements are consistent with those used in the prior year.

5. DIRECTORS' RESPONSIBILITY

The Company's Directors, under the Companies and Other Business Entities Act (Chapter 24:31), are responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the Group's consolidated financial statements and related information.

These abridged Group financial statements are presented in accordance with the International Financial Reporting Standards, the disclosure requirements of the Zimbabwe Stock Exchange (ZSE) Listing Rules.

The Directors have reviewed the performance and financial position of the Group and are satisfied that the Group has sufficient financial resources to continue as a going concern.

6. ASSET HELD FOR SALE

The Board of Directors approved the disposal of Softex Tissue Products (Private) Limited to ART Holdings Limited. An agreement of Softex Tissue Products (Private) Limited sale was signed on 3 May 2021. The total consideration is US\$800 thousand. The share of net (loss) / profit from the joint venture has been classified as discontinued operations.

7. RESTATEMENT DUE TO PRIOR PERIOD ERRORS

Prior year comparative financial information was restated. The impairment on Reserve Bank receivable and Nampak International Limited (NIL) interest and technical fees which was previously accounted for in the Statement of Profit or Loss were reversed and transferred to Non Distributable Reserve as they are capital contributions, as a result of NIL being an indirect shareholder in Nampak Zimbabwe Limited through Nampak Southern Africa Holdings Limited (Mauritius). Furthermore, the unrecognised Reserve Bank of Zimbabwe receivable impairment and Nampak International Limited interest and technical fees was correctly accounted for in the period ending 31 March 2020.

COMMENTARY

ECONOMY

The Group has achieved improved volumes and remains profitable due to a stable exchange rate resulting from the Reserve Bank of Zimbabwe's auction system. This has had the added effect of reducing the inflation rate significantly. The economic environment remains uncertain due to the macro-economic difficulties facing the country. The COVID-19 pandemic has affected consumer demand and consequently the Group and its results despite it being classified as an essential service.

HYPERINFLATIONARY PERFORMANCE

The half year reflected an increase in volumes for the Group despite the COVID-19 restrictions that were reintroduced at the beginning of the year, and which were lifted during April 2021. Foreign currency, although still inadequate for the Group's operations as a whole, was more available through the auction system introduced last year. The Group managed to source additional amounts needed from customers.

Revenue for the half year at ZW\$3,6 billion, in hyper-inflationary terms was 18% ahead of the prior year period. Sales volumes were up across all sectors of business except in the tobacco sector. However margins came under pressure in order to remain competitive. This resulted in a decrease of 12% in trading profit to ZW\$791 million.

All units continued to trade profitably with treasury and cash flow management being the key focus area. Net working capital was positive.

PRINTING AND CONVERTING SEGMENT

Hunyani Paper and Packaging: Sales volumes for the period were 15% ahead of prior year period. The major contributor to this increase was the commercial sector which was up 58%, due to increased demand from customers who recovered post COVID-19. The tobacco sector was 19% down on prior year period as late season orders did not materialise due to a lower 2020 tobacco crop.

Estates: We continue to engage with the relevant authorities to regain effective control over the Estates. It remains the intention to rehabilitate them for timber and agricultural purposes in line with Government's declared thrust in this direction.

PLASTICS AND METALS SEGMENT

MegaPak: Sales volumes grew by 61% against prior year period due to increased demand in the preforms and large injection moulding sectors. Closures were also up 18% compared to the prior year period.

CarnaudMetalbox: Sales volumes for the half year increased by 9% compared to the prior year period. In plastics, HDPE was 25% ahead of prior year period due to increased demand. Metals volumes increased by 16% with food cans and crowns leading the recovery. Closures were 29% below prior year period due to a shortage of raw materials.

CAPITAL EXPENDITURE

Capital expenditure of ZW\$58,3 million relates mainly to projects carried forward from the previous financial year. Various projects are under consideration and will be carried out subject to availability of foreign exchange.

DIVIDEND

The Directors have decided against declaring an interim dividend in view of the need to conserve available cash resources for raw material acquisitions and capital expenditure.

DIRECTORATE

There has been no change to the Directorate.

OUTLOO

The recent award of a 75% increase in wages within the packaging industry will impact on pricing structures and quite possibly on overall demand. Export performance can expect some reduction as our local cost base rises. The increase in the funds retention from exports to 40% further erodes our ability to obtain sufficient foreign exchange. The Authorities have warned of a third wave of the COVID-19 pandemic although this is expected to be mitigated by the vaccination programme that commenced in January 2021.

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Independent Auditor's Report on Review of Inflation Adjusted Interim Financial Information To the Shareholders of Nampak Zimbabwe Limited.

Introduction

We have reviewed the accompanying inflation adjusted abridged consolidated interim results of Nampak Zimbabwe Limited and its subsidiaries ("the Group") as at 31 March 2021 and the related inflation adjusted interim consolidated statement of comprehensive income, inflation adjusted interim consolidated statement of changes in equity and inflation adjusted consolidated interim statement of cash flows for the six month period then ended, and a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory notes.

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of this interim financial information in accordance with International Accounting Standard (IAS) 34 - Interim Financial Reporting. Our responsibility is to express a conclusion on this interim financial information based on our review.

Scope of review

We conducted our review in accordance with International Standard on Review Engagements 2410 - Review of Interim Financial Information Performed by the Independent Auditor of the Entity. A review of interim financial information consists of making inquiries, primarily of persons responsible for financial and accounting matters, and applying analytical and other review procedures. A review is substantially less in scope than an audit conducted in accordance with International Standards on Auditing and consequently does not enable us to obtain assurance that we would become aware of all significant matters that might be identified in an audit. Accordingly, we do not express an audit opinion.

Conclusion

Based on our review, nothing has come to our attention that causes us to believe that the accompanying interim financial information of Nampak Zimbabwe Limited does not present fairly, in all material respects, the inflation adjusted consolidated financial position of the Group as at 31 March 2021, and of its inflation adjusted consolidated financial performance and its inflation adjusted consolidated cash flows for the six month period then ended, in accordance with International Financial Reporting Standards
